

MACRO

- US equities were narrowly lower ahead of tonight's FOMC announcement.
- The Dow slipped 19.30 points to 27,071.42, the S&P 500 edged lower 2.53 points to 3,036.89, while the Nasdaq lost 49.13 points to 8,276.85.
- Wins for healthcare (+1.16%) and materials (+0.67%) while communications (-0.95%) and tech (-0.92%) led the laggards.
- The VIX gauge rose 0.69% to 13.20.
- The US dollar index eased slightly to 97.68, the EUR traded up to 1.1116, the yen was down at 108.84.
- US treasury yields were lower, the 2 year yield eased 1.8 bps to 1.640% while the 10 year yield slipped 1.6 bps to 1.837%.
- European shares were lower, the EuroSTOXX lost 0.16%, the German DAX inched lower 0.02%, while the UK FTSE fell 0.34%.
- Oil prices were mixed, Brent added 0.3% to \$61.49 while WTI fell 0.2% to \$55.42.
- Base metals were broadly higher, with nickel (+1.1%) leading the gains.

- In US economic data, the Conference Board's consumer confidence index eased to 125.9 in October
- The Case-Shiller home prices index rose 3.2% yoy in August.
- Pending home sales rose 1.5% in September.

PRECIOUS

- Gold traded a tight \$3 range through Asian hours.
- Gold printed the \$1494 high in early London hours.
- A \$10 drop during the London AM session saw the metal down to \$1485.
- The market bottomed out at \$1483 in choppier NY trading.
- The yellow metal finished the session lower at \$1487.
- Silver dipped to a low of \$17.62 before recovering to close flat.
- The Philadelphia gold and silver index rose 0.70% to 92.46.
- SPDR Gold Trust holdings fell 0.13% to 917.31mt.
